Grand Flute Concert by Maestro Shashank

NASA officially kicked off its Silver Jubilee celebration with a polished and poignant flute concert by fellow Sankethi, Shashank. NASA was honored and delighted to have this renowned artist perform for us at this year's gathering. Shashank made a vivid impression on the music world at a young age with a stunning flute performance at the Madras Music Academy in 1990. He is the youngest musician in the history of South Indian music to have performed the most prestigious SADAS concert at the Music Academy - Chennai, a privilege often reserved only for legends in Indian music. Since then he has performed and taught at most prestigious institutions across India and around the world. Trained by his father Subramanyam and vocal maestros such as R.K. Srikantan, Palghat K.V. Narayanaswami and Sandyavandanam Srinivasa Rao, Shashank is considered one of the best flautists of our time. In his rendition of Carnatic classical music, Shashank is well known for his intricate and intense aalaapanas, melodious keerthanas and pulsating kalpanaswaras. We were fortunate to have Maestro Shashank's concert be the highlight and centerpiece of festivities to inaugurate NASA's 25th Anniversary.

This year's General Body Meeting (GBM) ran smoothly and a new President and Board of Directors (BOD) were elected. Please see the following section for minutes from the GBM. Congratulations to the 2008-2010 BOD – we expect great things from this group!

4. 2008 NASA GBM Minutes

The 2008 NASA GBM was held on July 6, 2008 at the New Windsor Conference Center at 10:00 am

1. Welcome speech by Dr. Sridhara, NASA president
2. Roll call was taken. 40 registered members were in attendance. Quorum for 2008 GBM was established.
3. Copies of 2007 GBM minutes were made available to members. 2007 GBM Minutes had also been sent to all members in May 2008 newsletter. Sundaresan identified that the 2008 GBM notification published in the May 2008 newsletter was not signed by the secretary. A corrected 2008 GBM announcement will be added to NASA records, which will include the secretary's signature for the notification of 2008 GBM. A second correction was also noted. Item 19 of 2007 GBM minutes stated no need for filing tax returns. However, due to average gross receipts exceeding limits established by IRS, the implications for tax returns due for previous years have to be addressed. Sundaresan motioned to accept 2007 GBM minutes along with the correction. Dathatri Seconded. 2007 GBM minutes were accepted.
4. When the meeting was called to order, the general body observed a few moments of silence for those Sankethis who passed away this past year, namely, Mrs. Lakshmi Rao, Dr. S.N. Subbarao, Dr. K. Ramachandra Murthy and Harave Keshavamurthy.
5. Dr. Sridhara started president's speech by thanking BOD and their spouses/families for their excellent work. He commented on the difficulty the BOD had with regard to the fulfillment of treasurer's functions in a timely manner. He thanked Satyanarayana and Mahesh Rao for putting in long hours to get papers in order. He also pointed out NASA's aims and objectives and made references to several NASA activities that met NASA's aims and objectives. He thanked the founding fathers for well defined NASA's aims and objectives. He highlighted the key goal of the outgoing NASA Board in building the spirit of community and enthusiasm among Sankethis around North America including Canada and how this has been accomplished very well by numerous regional meetings and well attended annual events. As many as 20 new life members representing all parts of US and Canada joined NASA during the last two years. Active participation from the Texas region is a testament to this. He mentioned that the new NASA Directory was just published and that it would help in building new relationships. The directory includes NASA Aims and Objectives and the Sankethi Anthem.
6. While the spirit of the community is growing, he called on all members to take stock and engage in productive and constructive participation and communication to build the community during this Silver Jubilee year. The president thanked NASA's Silver Jubilee Committee for their contributions.
7. Sundaresan made a motion of special thanks to the president and BOD for all the hard work. Nataraja seconded the motion, which was then duly accepted.
8. Sundaresan pointed out that the term of all committees appointed by Dr. Sridhara would expire along with his presidency. The appointment of any committees during the next two years are the responsibility of the new president

9. Sundaresan made a motion to thank the Silver Jubilee Committee and it was seconded by Dathatri whereupon the motion was accepted.
10. NASA secretary Dr.Keshava Kumar presented the secretary's report. In his report, he mentioned that the maintenance of the NASA website is free of charge to the members. No confidential information has been provided to the website administrators. He acknowledged that the website needed many upgrades, and are being discussed with the website administrators. He also noted that many successful NASA regional events were held thought the year.
11. Dr. Jayaram made a motion to accept the secretary's report. The motion, duly seconded, was accepted
12. NASA treasurer Satyanarayana presented the treasurer's report.
13. A request was made to expand abbreviations in the treasures report. Treasurer's report was accepted
14. Report of special teams was taken up. Sundaresan presented the Audit Team report. It was noted that 2006 Treasurer's report would be revised to reflect changes and entered in to NASA records.
15. There were no other committee reports.
16. There was no old or unfinished business.
17. No new business items were discussed.
18. NASA President S. Sridhara requested Dr. Jayaram, who had been identified as the election officer in the May 2008 newsletter, to conduct the election of office bearers for the 2008-2010 term.
19. Election officer Dr. Jayaram conducted elections the elections and the following President and BOD members were elected uncontested for 2008-2010 term:
